CranMog did a splendid job on organising a display area for many cars and next year their efforts will be supported by the MSCC as well. Unfortunately due to miscommunication this year the chance of a lap of the circuit was missed and it is

planned to be better prepared for next year. To that end I am already discussing with the organisers to ensure that the LM62 Register are given the opportunity to form part of the parade in celebration of our 10th Anniversary and of course the 50th Anniversary of the Le Mans win. I am hoping that Keith Ahlers will have TOK in attendance but we will wait and see what the possibilities are during this busy year.

Please make every effort to attend to make a great show of our cars to the public. You won't be disappointed as it is a great event for all.

Spotlight Brackets

Since I have owned my car I have wanted to fit some classic Cibie Spotlights. Easy, one would first think but as always, not so...

First to find some... The particular model I wanted was the smaller (51/4") Cibie Tango units, manufacture stopped some time ago and some of the last chrome ones were going for £ 130 each! I was lucky and found some on eBay (as you do) and got a pair for £ 30 (although they were the black variant).

Next the fitting... It seems that the only offering for the cars with over riders (ours) is from Librand and these require drilling of the front wing to fit. Not too keen on this idea I decided to think of another plan. I had seen some that had been fitted to a later +4 by drilling the number plate box but again felt that this was too drastic and not sure that these would put the spot lights in the best position. So I was forced to solve the problem myself.

Inspiration came when I removed the over riders and saw that the bracket where they were mounted on was begging to be drilled with a lower hole allowing the over rider to be dropped (this also allowed the over riders to align better with the already lowered position when I adjusted the front cowl/number plate mount in an earlier project).



The original mounting hole (slot) is on the top and the new hole is 50mm lower. It was not that simple but a good drill with a sharp bit (and file) did the job on this strong alloy

Next I fabricated a cardboard template to create a part hidden bracket mounted directly behind the over rider and using the original mounting hole to fix it to the



bracket.

A local work shop cut the plates, formed the bend and sprayed them as a mock up and these fitted first time. The original plan was to fabricate these from stainless steel and may yet do this if anyone is interested







I am particularly pleased with the result and it was easy to wire them in as wiring is already installed to the underside of each wing and will allow the lights to be operated on Main Beam. (If anyone is interested I can get more made!)

This is truly a magnificent piece of modelling (and no it isn't a toy I keep telling Rita!) I panicked and purchased on-line but it appears that Morgan are now stocking these at a slightly more realistic price!

The detail is superb and it certainly does the car justice. This is the nearest I will ever get to owning a historic +4 Super Sport!
